STRONGER TOGETHER:

AN UPDATE ON OUR JOURNEY TO INTEGRATION

After many years of discussions and progress toward the goal, on December 20, 2025, the Boards of Directors of Alexandra Hospital, Ingersoll (AHI) and Tillsonburg District Memorial Hospital (TDMH) received support from the Ministry of Health (MOH), for the full integration of AHI and TDMH under the Ontario Not-for-Profit Corporations Act, 2010 (ONCA). This means that the MOH has given approval for AHI and TDMH to integrate under a new integration name, **Rural Roads Health Services** (RRHS), with each site maintaining its individual name.

Since 2014, AHI and TDMH have been governed by a Joint Board of Directors and have gradually integrated many strategic and leadership roles, include the Chief Executive Officer/President role and other positions. Over the next year, steps will be taken towards a common board, one professional staff organization and further internal administrative integration (where possible). We also hope to be able to share new integrated branding with the community in the near future, which is being developed in partnership with the Oxford County Communications Team.

As per the Boards of Directors, the key benefits of this integration are:

- The strength of two hospitals coming together voluntarily in a large, complex health care system
- Improving the sustainability of two small hospitals serving local communities
- Improving patient care and patient experience
- Integrating computer systems and digital solutions
- Reducing duplication; standardization of policies and processes

The Boards remain steadfast in their commitments in this integration including:

- Retaining TWO sites (namely, AHI and TDMH)
- Retaining TWO Foundations (namely, Alexandra Hospital Foundation and the Tillsonburg District Memorial Hospital Foundation)
- Collective agreements will be respected and changes to staff's working conditions will be negotiated through union leaders as part of the collective agreement negotiations

- Non-unionized staff will be engaged in ongoing dialogue about their working conditions and changes will not occur without consultation and dialogue
- Collective clinical service planning at the strategic level will occur as part of strategic planning, including community consultation
- Engaging team members throughout the process fostering a more cohesive culture across both hospitals
- Frequent, timely, and transparent communication
- Maintaining or improving quality of care and safety
- Improving access to care for our patients
- Strategically re-investing in infrastructure and care
- Contributing to improving the health care system
- · Living within our means

Where we are today is an evolution of many years of strong partnership and intentional planning and engagement with team members, physicians, patients, partners, volunteers, and the community. We are excited about becoming one integrated organization with two local sites. Through this, we are strengthening the sustainability of rural small community hospitals in the ever-changing health care landscape.

CAMPAIGN

All 2024 Capital Equipment on our list was funded thanks to you! TDMH Foundation Needs Your Help for 2025!

To help celebrate TDMH 100 years, we have identified a very important Capital Equipment fundraising initiative on top of our Annual Equipment Campaign. Comfort to those requiring care in the hospital plays a major role during the treatment process. *The hospital needs new patient beds and plans on purchasing 10 beds (8 med surg, 2 ICCU beds) at a cost of \$225,186.* This is the first phase of a multi-year initiative to replace all beds in the hospital.


Every year the Foundation works with the hospital to help fund the required highest priority needs of Capital Equipment. *To help add new technology to improve care*, as the Government does not fund Capital Equipment, *we are asking for your continued support and cannot do it without your generous gifts*, below is a list of some of the equipment required for 2025.



Glidescope

A Glidescope is an instrument that is used to support clinicians view of a patient's airway in emergency situations. The Glidescope can

help with intubation procedures, viewing vocal cords, and support patients who may have anatomical or traumatic injuries in which visualization of the airway is difficult. @ \$30,256 each, 1 required.



Vital sign monitors is a tool used that is used daily by the health care team to provide information about the physiological condition of the patient. The vital sign machine measures: Blood pressure, temperature, pulse and oxygen levels. Knowing these important measurements helps to inform care and

the treatment plan. @ \$3,313 each, 2 required.



Pain Pumps

A pain pump or infusion pump infuses small amounts of medications into the patient's circulatory system. Pain pumps may be used after certain surgeries to help control a patient's pain. @ \$5,569 each, 2 required.

Therapeutic Gastroscope

A gastroscopy is a test to check inside patient's throat, esophagus and stomach. The scope is an important diagnostic tool to check



what may be causing digestive problems such as difficulty swallowing, ingestion or heartburn. The Gastroscope is a thin, flexible tubed tool with a light and camera on the end. @ \$32,272 each, 1 required.

Arjo Ceiling Lift

Ceiling lifts are a motorized device that lifts and transfers a patient along an overhead track



mounted to the ceiling. The ceiling lift involves the use of a sling for the patient to be safely transferred one place to another such as from the bed to chair. @ \$ 13,084 each, 4 required.



Syringe Pump for emergent pediatric use

A pediatric syringe pump is used to ensure there is high accuracy and precision in medication delivery in

children. The syringe pump supports precise control over the medication delivery ensuring safe patient care. @ \$4,235 each, 1 required.

Radiology Monitor

A radiology monitor is used by radiologists to view diagnostic images such as X-rays, CT scans and more. Radiology monitors are an



important tool to help radiologists make accurate diagnosis. @ \$30,048 each, 1 required.



Operating Room Table

The purpose of a surgical table is to provide a stable and secure platform for patients while the surgical team operates.

The table can be moved in various positions to support an optimal approach and positioning of the patient s anatomical surgical site for easier access for surgery. @ \$57,672 each, 2 required.



Bed Replacement Program - Hill-Rom Centrella Max beds

Preferred beds for acutely ill, medical/surgical inpatients.

Patient Safety: Integrated features for fall prevention and early mobility support with bed exit alerts, clear visual indications of potential patient fall risks and verbal safety prompts

- * Pressure Injury Prevention: Therapeutic surfaces and positioning support to prevent sliding and simplify turns. Advanced air mattress systems support skin therapy reducing pressure ulcer risks.
- * Patient Monitoring Features: Help detect signs of patient deterioration, with contact-free, continuous heart and respiratory rate monitoring.
- * Keep patients comfortable and connected: Simple bed controls, efficient communication with care teams and easy access to personal device storage and charging. @ \$17,000 each, 8 required each year.

CALL FOR PATIENT & FAMILY ADVISORS



Alexandra Hospital Ingersoll (AHI) and Tillsonburg District Memorial Hospital (TDMH) have an active volunteer Patient and Family Advisory Committee (PFAC) that is seeking new membership from the community.

Patient and family advisors provide a

voice that represents all patients and families who receive care at our hospitals.

Advisors collaborate with AHI and TDMH leadership and team members, bringing their unique perspective from their experiences to improve the quality of care within the hospital.

- A Patient and Family Advisor is a person who has had a recent experience (within three years) of being a patient or the family member of a patient at one of our hospitals and lives within the communities serviced by AHI or TDMH.
- Advisors act as active partners to hospital leaders and team members to assist with the enhancement of quality, patient centered care.
- Some of the most recent quality improvement iniatiatives and activities that they have participated in include; patient surveys, Emergency Department optimization project, new CT scanner project, signage and wayfinding review and the new TDMH 12-bed unit.
